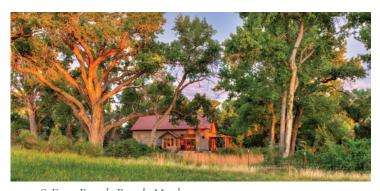

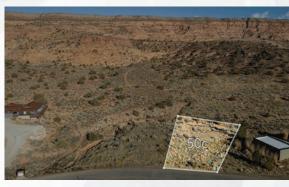

Lusic FOR THE PEOPLE

Moab Folk Festival returns for its 23rd year





Tith pleasant fall temperatures settling in to southeastern Utah, it can be an ideal time to enjoy some outdoor live music. One such opportunity is the annual Moab Folk Festival which, this year, takes place November 7-9, primarily at the Center Street Ballpark, with a couple of indoor evening concerts occurring, too, at historic Star Hall.

Former Moab resident Melissa Schmaedick founded the music festival in 2003; and, two years later the nonprofit Friends of the Moab Folk Festival was established with the goal of expanding its programming to include not only a weekend of outdoor music, but also school assemblies for local children; the Moab Free Concert Series, and a week-long folk camp for aspiring and established musicians.

Friends of the Moab Folk Festival Director Cassie Paup is excited about this year's music lineup. She's bringing back a

few festival favorites — "people's choice" winners from previous years, such as singer-songwriter Darrell Scott, and the band Elephant Revival — as well as a number of artists new to the festival, like Crys Matthews, who will perform on Saturday at the ballfield.

Paup heard Matthews perform at this year's Folk Alliance International Conference – the largest gathering of folk musicians and music industry professionals in the world. Paup attends the conference each year, where she previews

artists – legendary pros, as well as rising stars, who are showcased at the conference, for ideas on who to invite to Moab. Matthews won "Artist of the Year" at the 2024 International Folk Music Awards ceremony, and in 2022, her song *Changemakers* won "Song of the Year" at the awards ceremony. Additionally, Matthews won the Grand Prize for NewSong Music and Performance Competition at the Lincoln Center in 2017. She's been called "a bright star among the new generation of social justice music makers."









Paup also booked Seth Walker this year after listening to him perform at the Folk Alliance conference. Walker is an Americana artist, whose music contains elements of blues, rock, soul and jazz. He grew up on a Quaker commune in North Carolina, where every evening his musician parents would teach him classical music, a foundation that he says has served him well.

"Seth Walker is an artist that gets everyone smiling. Their hearts open from his performance," Paup says. "I've wanted to bring both artists (Matthews and Walker) for a while."

The music kicks off Friday evening with Darrell Scott, who will perform both Friday

and Saturday evenings at Star Hall. A fivepiece harmony band called Mother Tree will open for Scott on Friday, while Colorado-based musician Emily Scott Robinson will open the show on Saturday evening.

Darrell Scott plays both guitar and piano, and has been named "Songwriter of the Year" twice – by the Nashville Songwriters Association International, and by the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers. Additionally, Scott has been nominated for a Grammy award on four occasions – twice for songs he penned, and twice as a performing artist. He is also a Nashville Songwriter Hall of Fame nominee.

His new cover album, *The New Modern Hymns*, features songs written by legendary artists like Guy Clark, Joni Mitchell, Kris Kristofferson, and Leonard Cohen – "heroes and sheroes" – who Scott says he wanted to honor. Concertgoers will likely hear a few of those songs at Star Hall.

Saturday's headliner at the ballfield is one of Colorado's most beloved folk bands, Elephant Revival – a collection of multi-instrumentalists who blend elements of Celtic, Americana, Folk, and Indie Art Rock into their music.

Opening the festivities on Saturday will be the North Carolina-based trio, Tenasi, a band that performs its Appalachian-influenced music worldwide, while also learning other cultures' music along the way. In 2025, Tenasi won an International Endowment of the Arts grant to help fund their travels sharing and learning music from around the world. The band is comprised of Mary Lucey, who sings, plays bass and

clawhammer banjo, renowned dobro player Billy Cardine, and singer and guitarist Anya Hinkle.

The weekend also includes two all-female groups – the bluegrass-inspired Della Mae, which includes two-time Grand National Fiddle Champion Kimber Ludiker, Avril Smith performing lead guitar and mandolin, and bass player Vickie Vaughn,

a two-time International Bluegrass Music Association "Bass Player of the Year."

The other all-female band is Big Richard, a group of independent musicians who came together to perform in 2021 to help out a friend who realized at the last minute he needed a female act to round out a gig he was promoting. The women had so much fun playing together that

night, that they decided to stay together as a band. Since then, the group, who performs its own style of old-time music, have performed at multiple music festivals, and have been featured on NPR and PBS.

The festival's Gospel Hour will get things going on Sunday, with various main stage artists joining forces for an hour of "inspirational" music, says Paup.

Closing out this year's festival on Sunday is Yonder Mountain String Band, a group that has performed at the renowned Telluride Bluegrass Festival on 23 occasions. Yonder Mountain was inducted into the Colorado Hall of Fame last year. And in 2008, the band "opened for Barack Obama," after being invited to perform at the Democratic National Convention in Denver.

Throughout the weekend at the ball-field various vendors will be selling unique clothing, handcrafted jewelry, locally-made herbal products, artwork and more. As always, Aardvark Guitars from Torrey, Utah, will be there with an array of vintage musical instruments.

A half-dozen different food trucks will also be on site, as well as craft beer for sale from festival sponsor Bohemian Brewery.

Master violinist and Yonder Mountain fiddle player Coleman Smith will also be at the festival with his Camp Coletrain – a mobile music workshop based out of Buena Vista, Colorado.

Paup says families will definitely want to visit this youth-focused activity during the weekend.

The week prior to the weekend festival musicians perform free concerts for Grand County schoolchildren, and teach music lessons for string and band students. It's a long-standing tradition the schools look forward to, says Kari Bernard, the Principal at Margaret L. Hopkin Middle School. "Students learn a couple of songs, and the stories behind the pieces," she says. "I've seen students fall in love with music because of this opportunity the festival provides for our students."

Other free community events include morning workshops held at Star Hall, prior to the ballpark gates opening on Saturday and Sunday. This year's workshops include an interview with Darrell Scott on Saturday, while Sunday's event features a singer-inthe-round presentation by Cosy Sheridan, Crys Matthews and Emily Scott Robinson.

The Moab Folk Camp, founded by Sheridan and the late T.R. Ritchie, takes place the week leading up to the festival. The camp is a week of adult music education taught by various festival artists. "Campers" come for instruction in voice and performance, songwriting, bass, guitar, and harmony singing. There's also instruction in beginning ukulele, banjo, mandolin, and guitar, plus advanced guitar. While teachers change from year to year – depending on who's performing at the festival that year – many of the "campers" seeking instruction come back every year, Sheridan says.

All of the camp instructors perform a free concert on Monday, the week of the folk camp. The concert provides a "snippet" of what concertgoers will experience during the festival, says Sheridan. The free event takes place at the Moab Arts and Recreation Center at 7 p.m., and is open to the public.

ongtime Grand County resident and current county commissioner Mary McGann welled up with emotion as she was named the recipient of the 2025 "TrailblazHER" award at this year's Moab Women's Festival, called the Decompress Fest. The announcement followed a day of music and comedy on the stage behind the Aarchway Inn.

"Grand County is home to so many remarkable women," McGann says. "I was honored and humbled to receive the award."

In addition to her role as a county commissioner, McGann has been an educator and active community member for many years. She was selected by a panel of women of varying ages, backgrounds and experiences, out of 17 women nominated by the community. The panel evaluated nominees on four metrics: community impact, mentorship of women and girls, personal growth, and authentic leadership. Local community

leaders Rhiana Medina and Marcy Till were also honored with awards at the ceremony.

"It is so fitting to have a festival honoring and recognizing women, happening in our exquisite valley, where so many strong, capable, visionary women reside," McGann says. "I'm thankful to Toni and Teresa for having the vision and tenacity to start such a wonderful festival."

Moab locals and friends Toni Sicola and Teresa Herd dreamed up the festival last spring, and put it together in time for its debut in the fall of 2024. The theme for the festival's second year encouraged attendees to decompress from the busy pace of life and from the political division happening in the world, and instead focus on celebrating the local community and the women who have contributed to it.

For 2025, the event expanded to two days, September 13 and 14. Before Sunday's festival with music, vendors and nonprofits, there was a full day of activities and workshops at various locations throughout town, capped by a "Drag, Drop and Decompress" show at the Helipad on Saturday night.



DAY 1

"It was a bigger bite than we took last year," Sicola says, referring to the extra day of activities they added to the festival.

Attendees who bought tickets for Saturday could choose from more than a dozen offerings. Letia Perry, who also participated in last year's fest, offered a breathwork class in the morning. Outlaw Adventure Tours, a local women-owned company, guided two off-road excursions. The afternoon tour was rainy, but that turned out to be a treat as participants witnessed seldom seen waterfalls cascading off the red rock cliffs.

"It was a once-in-a-lifetime experience for people who don't live here," Sicola says.

Sicola, though busy helping to manage the event, had the chance to sit in on a class called Intro to Heart Coherence, taught by health practitioner Sarah Cook.

"It was great," Sicola says. "She's such a smart lady and she's very in tune. It was really interesting information and people were really engaged and asking good questions."

Leah Olson, development director for local nonprofit Seekhaven, staffed that organization's booth on Sunday and she

participated in workshops offered on Saturday by Moab's Sundial Medicinals, owned by Emily Stock. Students learned to make medicinal and personal care products from common pantry items like apple cider vinegar, garlic, oils and herbs.

"Learning some of the science behind it was so cool," Olson said. "Emily has such a wealth of knowledge."

Asia Raine, who lives in Helper, Utah, offered two jewelry-making workshops held in the yurt at the Moab Valley Multicultural Center. Like other locations for workshops, the space was donated for the festival.

"Everybody responded really well to the meditation part of it, the connection with the stones," Raine said. She showed her class how to size their rings, cut the band from a strip of metal, file and heat it with a torch, attach the stone setting and then set the stone before the final polish.

Other workshops included yoga, Taiko drumming, and meditation. Also throughout the day, five artists with Salt Lake City's Rekindled and Co., a tattoo, barber and massage studio, set up a pop-up tattoo parlor inside the Moab Arts Center.

Jessica Thacker got a tattoo commemorating a beloved rooster that she had to give away because they're not allowed in Grand County.

"(But) I can still go see him anytime" on the farm in La Sal where he now lives, Thacker said, as artist Nicole LaRue inked the design.

Thacker was also a vendor on Sunday, selling her homemade barbecue sauce and spice rubs, along with other products.

The day ended at the Helipad venue with a free, open-to-the-public event called Drag, Drop and Decompress, featuring music, comedy and drag. Singer/songwriter Darcy Nelson, who also led a mantra workshop that day, opened the show. Local band The Butch Cassidies played original songs in their folk style.

Los Angeles-based comedian Amy Geist got laughs from the crowd of around 200 people, and Salt Lake City drag queen White Chocolate emceed in a voluminous blonde wig and pale pink dress sparkling with sequins. The evening ended with the audience dancing to music played by DJ Tiffany Jade.

DAY 2

Sunday saw vendors set up tents on the spacious lawn at the Aarchway Inn, and the stage was busy with entertainment from early afternoon until the festival wrapped up around 8 p.m.

Attendees browsed jewelry, art, sweet treats, books, clothing, and services from local artists and businesses. Local artist Emily Sukiennik, of Cactus & Bloom, brought her handmade jewelry. Painter Lizzie Jones displayed her colorful acrylic works of mystical scenes. Katie Hansen of Moab Oasis offered mobile IV therapy, which can help people rehydrate and recover from illness or exertion. Katie Grauel of Moab Rolfing offered mini-sessions of the holistic manual therapy that she normally gives from her office in the Moab Free Health Clinic. Drinks were available from the Stargazer, Sicola's bus-turned-mobile-cocktail-lounge that she uses in her event planning business.

Nonprofits and community organizations also attended. Local nonprofit Seekhaven, which provides free, confidential and services to survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault, was one of the beneficiaries of the festival.

Donations like the one from the festival, Seekhaven's Leah Olson said, are helpful for nonprofits because they're not earmarked for something specific, so the organization can use the money where it's most needed.

The Women's Business Center of Utah was the other beneficiary of the festival.

"Seekhaven is for women and people that are in crisis; the Women's Business Center is for people that are trying to thrive (in business)," Sicola explains. "We wanted to be able to lift up both groups."

A new local climbing gym, Climb Moab, is featured on the front cover of the Women's Business Center of Utah's 2023-2024 impact report. The report notes that the center helped 292 new businesses that year, which created 1,322 jobs.

The League of Women Voters staffed a booth representing their nonpartisan organization, which promotes civic engagement.

Representatives from the southern Utah branch of Equality Utah, an LGBTQ advocacy group, also had a table on Sunday, as did Moab Pride and local radio station KZMU.

Onstage, the audience got a sneak preview of a community theater production performed in September, called "Leaving A

Trace", followed by Sicola performing with her local band, Toni and the Enablers, and another stand-up set from Geist. Singer-songwriters Abby Posner and Raye Zaragoza followed, and headliner Jenn Grinels performed soulful folk rock to close the festival.

The TrailblazHER award ceremony came just before the headlining act. Sicola and Herd agree it was one of their favorite moments of the festival.

"For me it was just so heartwarming to see the reception from the crowd," Herd says.

Herd and Sicola expressed gratitude to the community leaders, volunteers, organizations and businesses that support the festival and donate money, time and services.

"We had incredible community support," Sicola says. "Our volunteer team was awesome." Around 50 people volunteered to help facilitate the two-day event.

Herd and Sicola say they plan to keep putting on the festival, adapting it based on community feedback. They've already become a nonprofit, which will help secure grant funding in the future. While the format might evolve, Herd says the event will remain one that uplifts local women leaders.

"It's not just a festival for women, it's a festival that celebrates women."

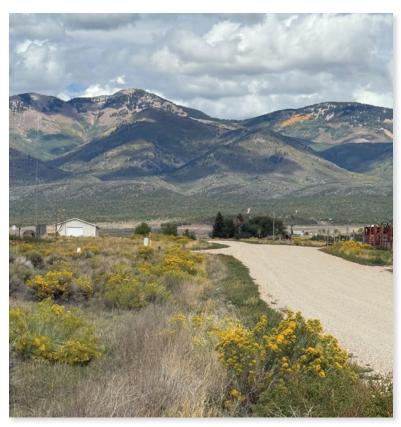

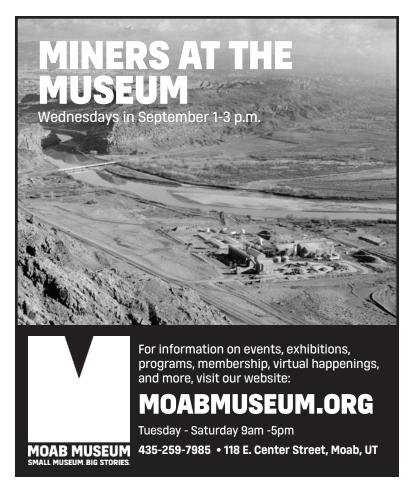
